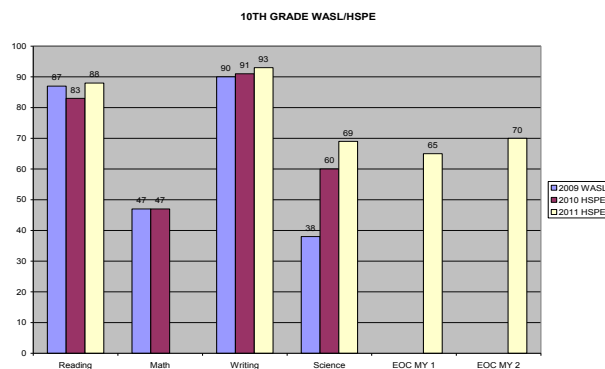

Teachers will develop pre and post unit assessments in Biology that are aligned with state standards and end of course assessment rubrics to inform their instruction throughout the course sequence

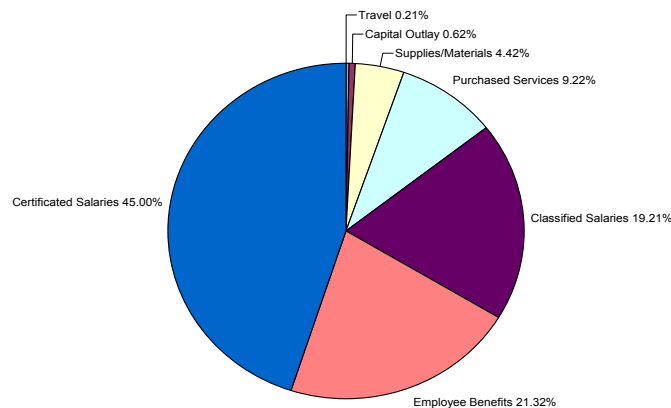
### Math
